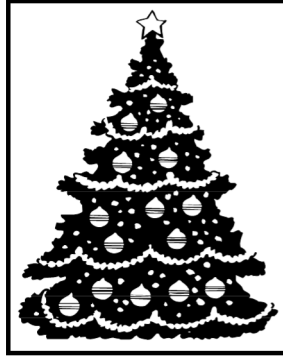

BOARD BRIEFS

ROAD RESURFACING POSTPONED:

The Board had a meeting with Paving Solutions Corp. following the November Board meeting. At that time, it was decided that, due to the impact of weather conditions on other jobs, the sealing of Myrtle Trace Drive will be postponed until January. However, if possible, the section of road from Myrtle Ridge Road to Cedar Ridge Lane may be done in December. The Board will receive at least one week notice from the contractor.

2019 ANNUAL BUDGET

At the November Board meeting, the MTHOA 2019 budget was adopted. The budget reflects consideration and planning for current and future needs. The budget includes funds for the construction of more retaining walls, the dredging of more lakes and refurbishing the kitchen in the Clubhouse. The Board believes that the budget will provide funds to benefit the community and at the same time stay financially sound without a dues increase.

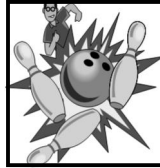
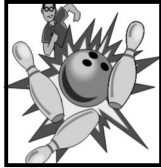

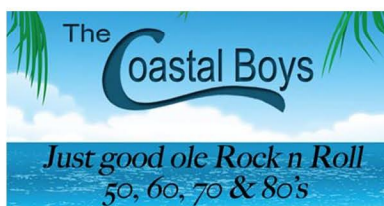
